

This is part of the song that Mr. Rogers sang at the beginning of his television show. The message that he was sending to the children was enlightening. To be kind and generous and help your neighbors. To illustrate to them that it is not just in the neighbourhood that you live in; but also, your church and school neighbors. To be respectful of people and help the elderly and those in need. To become friends with the school bullies and show them the way of relating with others in kindness, not meanness. A person passed us, in order to put on his flashing lights on top of his pickup truck. We kept a distance, so people would be aware of danger. Unbelievably, two or three vehicles passed us, and they almost went off the road when this troubled vehicle swerved over to the passing lane once again. It was like watching it in slow motion, just waiting for a major collision of so many cars. I thought to myself; how selfish and impatient were these people to risk everyone's lives for themselves. They were most certainly not being a good neighbour.

Just at the precise moment that I said to Hub that I think someone is having a heart attack; the car was in the passing lane, hit five guard posts and flew over top of the guardrail, down an embankment of twenty feet. We instantly pulled over to the side of the road, along with the two vehicles ahead of us, to help whoever was in that car. It was an elderly woman having cardiac issues, completely confused as to what had just transpired. Someone phoned 911 immediately and the man in the truck went down to the vehicle, without hesitation, not knowing what to expect. Hub grabbed one of our blankets in the car to keep her warm. Soon the police were there, highway patrol and the ambulance and took her to the hospital. I thanked God that all these people were willing to stop, and making it happen for this person to receive assistance. I am also extremely grateful for the protection from the repercussions; due to the selfishness of people speeding by. I hope that they never find themselves in a similar position, where everyone drives by them, or their family. I would hope that if I was ever in this situation, that good Samaritans would be there in a heartbeat.
